Thank you for submitting your work to The Nordic Association of Otorhinolaryngology in Tromsø 2025.

A poster allows your colleagues to study your work for as long they wish and enables more personal interaction with those interested in your work. Hence, you are encouraged to be present at your poster for lunch breaks and other breaks.

The abstract content must be presented, including all authors, and contact information (e.g., email address, WhatsApp user, telephone number) for at least one author.

In addition, funding and potential conflicts of interest (COI) must be declared.

You are welcome to add images, tables, and detailed data to better document your work. Since there will be many other posters, you must make sure your poster is interesting and visually compelling if you hope to attract viewers.

The posters will have "portrait" format, Paper A0: height 1189 mm x width 841 mm (or 46.8 x 33.1 in), and in any case no larger than H120 x W90 cm.

Please feel free to use the poster template at the end of this file if you find it useful.

Posters should be posted at the latest during the coffee break Wednesday morning and taken down after noon Friday.

Poster walk. There will be organized a poster walk during the Friday lunch break, where we strongly encourage you to be present at your poster.

Best poster prize. The jury will evaluate all posters for the best poster prize. The winner will be presented during the Closing ceremony.






